## Personalized, compassionate care.



We provide early intervention services to children ages 0-3 who have delays and disabilities. During these years, the brain is rapidly developing, making this the optimal time for therapy.

### Assessment

Our evaluation team — consisting of a special education teacher, physical therapist, occupational therapist, speech therapist, and medical director (if needed) — thoroughly assess your child's development. We customize a treatment and support plan to help your child reach their fullest potential.

### Therapy

We provide individualized occupational, physical and speech therapy. We focus on therapeutic play in natural environments to give families practical skills you can use with your child at home.

### Education

Our certified special education teachers are developmental intervention specialists. They facilitate age-appropriate cognitive, social and behavioral learning through play, routines and social interactions.

### Support

Our team of medical professionals and social workers helps coordinate health care for your child, connects you to community resources and social services, and empowers you with tools to serve as an advocate for your child.
